## **Feed the Cats**





Kitty and cat are hungry, can you feed them some treats? Games suitable for all ages

## Supplies needed:

Prinout of the cats Spoon Coloring pencils Glue/tape Scissors/utility knife Optional: cereal Optional: dice





## **Directions:**

1- Print the cat pages onto stiff paper or glue them to a cereal box to make them more durable. (You could also laminate pieces after coloring them.)

2- Color and cut out the fish treats. Fold them slighty in half to make them easier to pick up.

3- Cut the cats out along the dotted line and cut the mouths out. Tape the cats to cereal bowls/small box/plastic tub, as shown in the picture, to keep them upright and to catch treats.

## How to play

You can get creative with the kinds of games and activities you play with your cutouts of Kitty and Cat. They are really hungry today! Below are some ideas to get you started (by level of difficulty):

<u>Level 1</u>- Using a spoon or fingers, see who can feed Kitty & Cat faster, or set a short timer and count how many treats were fed in that time (for higher numbers use cereal).

Level 1 - Learn colors. Color the fish different colors, and ask your child to pick a specific color to feed the cat. (Ex. "Can you feed Kitty the red fish?")

<u>Level 1</u>- Learn numbers - ask your child to feed the cats specific numbers of treats similar to above.

<u>Level 2</u>- Throw dice, reading the number and then feed the corresponding amount of treats to the cats. You can throw the dice once for eac

h cat, feed them, and then examine the bowls and compare who has more/less.

<u>Level 2</u>- Have kids stand a few yards back, with treats on a spoon and have them (walk, skip, spin, crawl, crab-walk, walk backwards, scoot, shimmy, dance, wiggle, get creative!) their way to the cat without dropping the treat.

<u>Level 2</u>- As above but assign movements to each side of a dice, and have kids roll on their turn to see what movement they get.

<u>Level 3</u>- A 2 player game. Each person throws dice on their turn and feeds their cat that amount of cereal. After (x) amount of rounds, count how many pieces of cereal your cat has eaten. The cat with more cereal wins.

Level 3- Hide the fish in a room and have kids find the fish to feed the cats.
